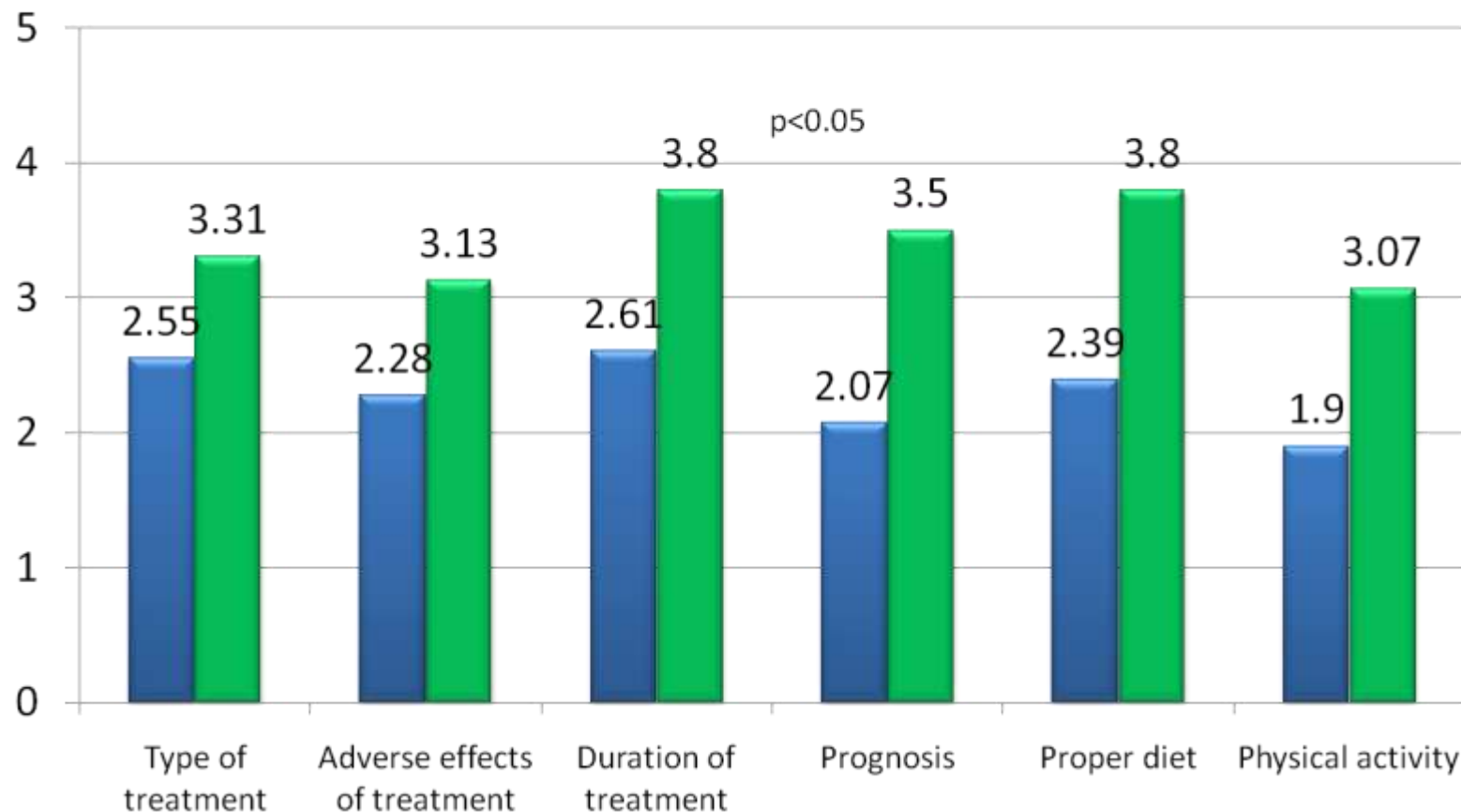
METHODS

- January-August 2009
- Two Haematology Day Care Units in Athens
- Cross-sectional study design
- 87 lymphoma patients (42 female, 45 male - 88% Non-Hodgkin)
- 61-item self report questionnaire
- Demographic and educational level data

Perception of one's own knowledge

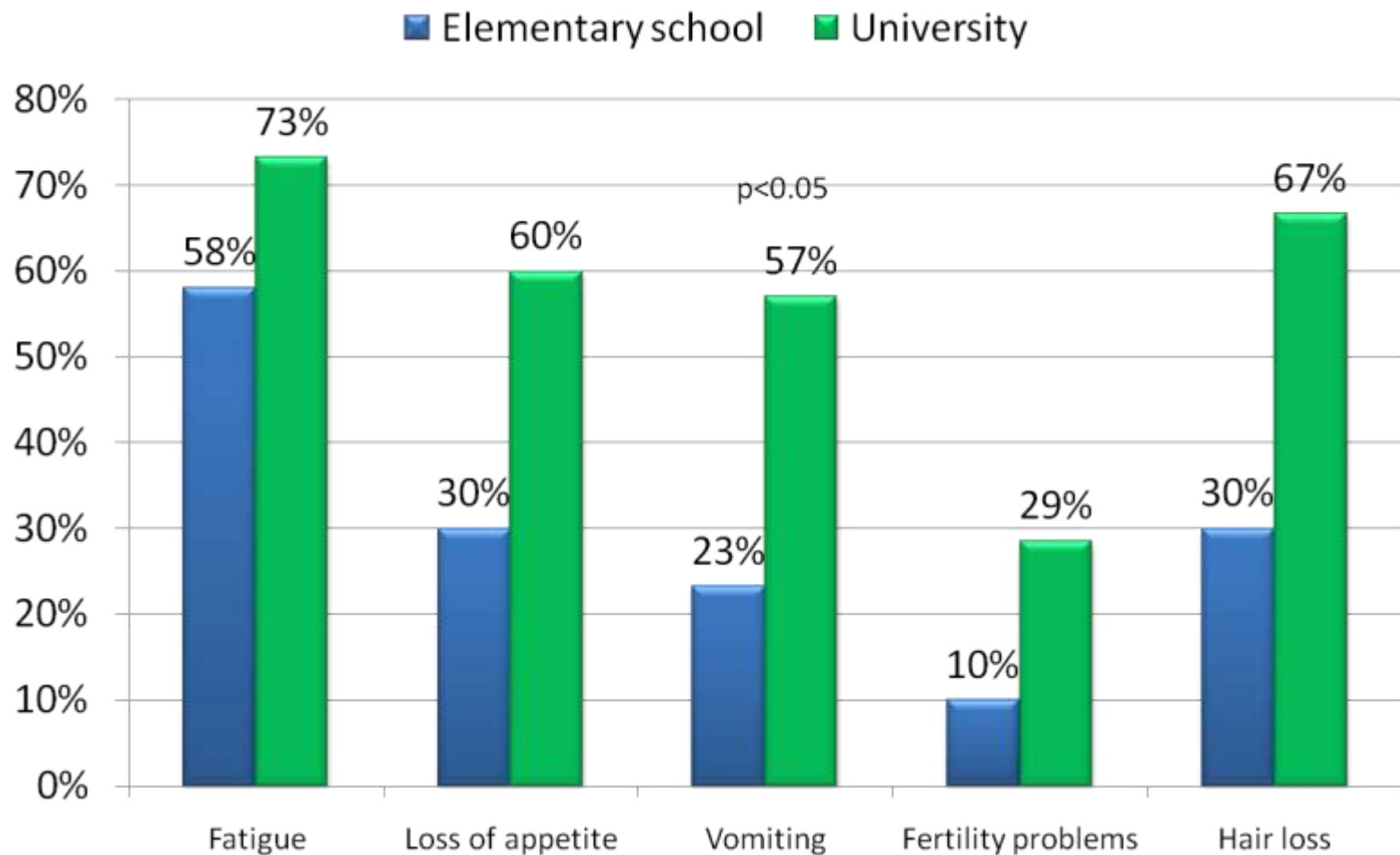
■ Elementary school ■ University
